Call Meeting to Order - 4:00 p.m.

#### **Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:**

**Johanna Casey, City Clerk:** Reads the statement of compliance, followed with the flag salute and roll call is taken.

#### **Roll Call – Board of Commissioners:**

Mayor Becker, Commissioner Amodeo and Commissioner Blumberg were present. Chief Dan Adams, Chief Matt Hankinson, Lisa McLaughlin, Roger McLarnon, Ed Dennis, Johanna Casey, Kenneth Mosca and Scott Abbott, Esquire were also present.

#### **Approval of Minutes:**

The minutes from the March 16, 2023 Workshop/Capital & Regular Meeting were approved as read on motion by Commissioner Blumberg, seconded by Commissioner Amodeo, with a vote of three ayes.

#### **Presentation:**

**Michael Garcia,** Ford Scott & Associates: Speaks on the procedure to approve a municipal budget. Introduces the 2023 municipal budget. The public hearing on the 2023 municipal budget will be held on May 4, 2023 during the regular commission meeting.

#### **Public Comment:**

**Richard Sless,** 13 East Drive, Linwood: Request the Commissioners consider a name change of Margate Library to the "Joan Sless Library". Joan Sless was a lifelong Margate resident, and worked at the library and for numerous Margate organizations.

#### **Ordinances: Introduction**

Johanna Casey: Reads Ordinance #06-2023 by title.

A motion for introduction of **Ordinance** #06-2023, authorizing the cost-of-living increase of 3.5% incorporated into the 2023 municipal budget, was put forth by Commissioner Blumberg, Seconded by Commissioner Amodeo, with a vote of three ayes.

# ORDINANCE #06-2023 CALENDAR YEAR 2023 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City in the County of Atlantic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, City Commissioners of the City of Margate City hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$247,210.26 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City, in the County of Atlantic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Margate City shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$865,235.91, and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the City of Margate City be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

## RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A REVOCABLE LICENSE FOR A PORTION OF CITY PROPERTY ADJACENT TO 7 S. GRANVILLE AVENUE AND 8 S. GLADSTONE AVENUE, BLOCK 108.02, LOT 22, MARGATE CITY

WHEREAS, M & A Management Team, LLC (hereinafter "Licensee") is the owner of certain real property located at 7 S. Granville Avenue and 8 S. Gladstone Avenue, Margate City, New Jersey, designated on the Tax Map of the City of Margate as Lot 22 in Block 108.02; and

WHEREAS, Licensee has requested a License for an existing overhang/awning measuring approximately 19' in width x 36" in depth on both Granville Avenue and Gladstone Avenue, all of which is more fully detailed on a Survey prepared by Paul Koelling & Associates, LLC, a professional licensed surveyor dated January 26, 2022 which is attached to the License Agreement as Schedule A; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City has determined that it would be in the best interest of the public to permit Licensee to utilize the requested licensed area as requested; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that the proposed licensed area is not required for public use; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners has determined that a Revocable License Agreement would not be detrimental to the surrounding properties.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, Atlantic County, New Jersey that it does hereby direct the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a Revocable License Agreement with M & A Management Team LLC, so as to allow the overhang/awnings located on the subject building, which licensed area is located along the front of 7 S. Granville Avenue and 8 S. Gladstone Avenue adjacent to Block 108.02, Lot 22.

#### RESOLUTION #87-2023 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE CITY, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, SUPPORTING OUR FIRST RESPONDERS ACT

WHEREAS, our country's emergency medical services (EMS) system is facing a crisis that jeopardizes the health and safety of every man, woman, and child. The additional burdens placed on EMS systems and personnel during the pandemic exposed years of underfunding that is now creating a breaking point – at a time when 9-1-1 calls have increased in most jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, across the country, EMS response can vary depending on where you live. It consists of a diverse group of 400,000 healthcare practitioners, including hospital-based paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs), and dual role firefighter/EMTs across 21,000 locations. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, fatality rates among paramedics and EMTs were highest across all healthcare workers at approximately 14 deaths per 100,000 workers during the height of the COVID pandemic<sup>1</sup>. Together, the pressures of the pandemic and ongoing opioid and mental health epidemics, combined with low pay and/or poor benefits, have contributed to an overall 30% turnover rate of full and part-time EMTs and paramedics across the country; and

WHEREAS, these staffing shortages, combined with skyrocketing costs to purchase equipment and fuel, are forcing EMS agencies to make difficult decisions including whether to reduce or even cease operations. As more agencies shut down, remaining agencies are required to cover larger areas, leaving families without immediate assistance in their greatest moment of need when timing can mean life or death; and

**WHEREAS**, today, only 13 states classify EMS as an essential service. Because of this designation, local governments are not required to provide emergency medical services. Unlike firefighting and police, EMS agencies do not have wide access to federal and state funding.

#### The Supporting Our First Responders Act

To address this crisis, the bipartisan *Supporting Our First Responders Act* would authorize **\$50 million per year for five years** to establish a grant program under the Department of Health and Human Services allowing public, private, and non-profit EMS agencies, along with State and local governments to apply for grants to:

- Hire, recruit, and retain trained medical personnel
- Support the well-being of EMS personnel
- Provide reimbursement for required trainings
- · Constructing and modifying facilities to improve coverage and response time
- Upgrade and purchase new equipment, medication, and vehicles

; and

**WHEREAS**, this legislation would also provide \$5 million per year in technical assistance to assist EMS agencies with the grant application process. In addition, this legislation requires the Secretary of Health and Human Services to provide Congress with detailed reports on existing challenges and recommendations to problems facing the EMS community including:

- Detailing the disparities and inadequacies in providing federal and private reimbursement for EMS
- Detailing the challenges specific to rural EMS departments and nonaffiliated EMS departments
- Detailing the feasibility of establishing a lead Federal office to implement recommendations to improve advocacy and collect data for EMS personnel

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the Governing Body of the City of Margate City asserts this legislation would permanently extend the Emergency Triage, Treatment, and Travel (ET3) Model, first developed by the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) as a way to reimburse EMS agencies for their services that don't involve hospital transport. Permanently extending this practice, which was first waived at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, would allow EMS agencies to be reimbursed for Treatment-In-Place (TIP) or alternative transport. CMS has reported that these extensions would save taxpayers more than \$560 million per year<sup>2</sup>.

The Supporting Our First Responders Act will invest the necessary resources in these heroes so they're able to continue serving our communities; and the City Clerk shall share the Mayor and Commissioners expression by forwarding a copy of this Resolution to all members of the United States House of Representatives and United States Senate representing the City of Margate City.
