

RESOLUTION #203 OF 2013

AUTHORIZE CHANGE IN TITLE, TEXT, OR AMOUNT OF APPROPRIATION
PURSUANT TO N.J.S. 40A: 4-85

WHEREAS, N.J.S. 40A: 4-85 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may, at the request of, or with the consent of, the governing body of any county or municipality, make such correction of the title, text, or amount of any appropriation appearing in the budget as may be necessary to make said item of appropriation available for the purpose or purposes required for the needs of any county or municipality;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S. 40A: 4-85, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City hereby requests the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to make the following correction in the 2013 Budget:

Appropriation title: Contribution to Lifeguard Pension \$20,000

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the foregoing correction is, in the opinion of the governing body, warranted and authorized by the statute referred to above, and is necessary for the orderly operation of the City of Margate City for the reasons set forth:

The 2013 Municipal Budget as approved by the City Commission on April 4th, 2013 provides for funding of the City of Margate Pension Plan for Lifeguards as required by City Ordinance 1987-16. The City's 2013 Municipal Budget includes the City's obligation of \$20,000 to fund the Lifeguard Pension in the appropriation titled Lifeguards Salaries & Wages and needs to be corrected. Lifeguards Salaries & Wages should be decreased by \$20,000, from \$540,200 to \$520,200, and the appropriation titled Contribution to Lifeguard Pension should be added with the corresponding \$20,000.
