**AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDER NO.1  
NJEDA NEIGHBORHOOD STREETScape  
COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION/STREETScape PROGRAM**

Lexa Concrete, LLC, Hammonton, New Jersey

**WHEREAS**, on August 6, 2016 Resolution #154-2015, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate authorized the award of a contract to Lexa Concrete, LLC of Hammonton, NJ for the Neighborhood Streetscape Community Revitalization in the amount of \$396,960.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Engineer, Edward Walberg submitted a letter dated February 1, 2016 regarding Change Order No.1, that related to Additional Trees, -As Built Quantities for this project amending the contract amount by \$8,538.39, resulting in a new contract amount of \$405,498.39; and

**WHEREAS**, NJEDA funded portion will not increase, and Margate City portion will increase in the amount of \$8,538.39; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Financial Officer has certified in writing that adequate funds are available under Capital Ordinance #2009-19 C-04-55-955-902 - \$8,538.39.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey, that the City Administrator is hereby authorized to sign said Change Order No. 1 for the additional trees, -As Built Quantities for the project in the amount of \$8,538.39, with Lexa Concrete, LLC amending the contract amount to \$405,498.39.
