

Now we plan on taking our partnership a step further!



BULKHEAD REPLACEMENT CONTINUES



Despite some legal challenges, the City of Margate continues our efforts to create a safer and more beautiful Bayfront area by working with local business owners on the replacement of the damaged bulkhead and the beautification of local properties. We are happy to report that we continue to make consistent forward progress in this area.

After completing 275 of bulkhead replacement this past summer in cooperation with **Barbary Coast LLC & Harbour Bay,** LLC, the City has now reached an agreement for replacement of 588 additional feet of bulkead on the property leased by Lamberti's restaurant. The new bulkhead will be 8 ft above the mean water line. contributing to the flood mitigation steps that have been implemented in the area. A public promenade is being designed for this area which many residents and businesses are excited to see move forward.



An additional bonus of the renegotiated Lamberti agreement includes 24 parking spaces being made available to residents and visitors in their Amherst Avenue parking lot from 7am until 5pm seven days a week.

As residents know, creating parking where there is none is a difficult task for coastal communities. Working out new partnerships that serve the public's needs is a primary goal for the City.





Working together with the residents, governments & community organizations of Absecon Island – which includes Atlantic City, Longport, Margate & Ventnor – Sustainable Downbeach & the South Jersey Chapter of the Surfrider Foundation have raised awareness of the harmfulness of plastic marine litter. They were recognized by NJDEP for effectively connecting people from different backgrounds to fight towards the common goal of preserving our coastline through a variety of activities, including the passage of legislation to prevent plastic pollution. Ventnor, Margate & Longport have received a grant to purchase a 'Portable Water Bottle Refill Station! We will share it for public events! Requests for the use of the station need to be made to the Green Team in advance to insure availability.

Beach sweeps & bay cleanups have netted thousands of plastic water bottles from our waterways. Our combined community green teams work diligently promote plastic pollution Condiment Containers awareness. We encourage the use of reusable water bottles.

The station will provide filtered drinking water for activities & public events and will serve as an educational tool. Our aim is to discourage the use of single use plastics. So next event, bring your own bottle! We will keep it filled!
