A Message from Mayor Mike Becker

Welcome to summer in Margate and a very special welcome to all our summer guests. I ask all of you to be careful driving, crossing streets and biking while enjoying all Margate has to offer ...beautiful beaches, fine dining, shopping, and fishing and boating.

There have been many accomplishments since May of 2011, when I was reelected to serve as Mayor of this great city. Each and every single initiative saves our taxpayers money and allows the City to operate more efficiently and productively. We hired a new auditing firm which is currently working on a comprehensive audit to be presented at our June 21st meeting; we hired a new local Bond Counsel who is working to restructure some of our City debt to save money; we hired a Business Administrator with a wealth of municipal experience; we cut capital spending by 2 million per year; we reorganized the beach badge department saving money on promotion and increasing sales revenue; we canceled the ordinance for firehouse #2, lowering the City's debt by 2.8 million; we redesigned Firehouse #1 saving 2.5 million, and last but not least, we combined the Planning and Zoning boards for a saving of \$35,000.

In addition, we are holding Town Hall Meetings for our summer residents and we have instituted this quarterly newsletter in an effort to better communicate with all our residents both seasonal and year round. We have two Town Hall Meetings scheduled for this summer. One is scheduled for Saturday, June 30th at the Bloom Pavilion at 9 am and the other on Saturday, July 28th at the Bloom Pavilion at 9 am. I am all for transparency in government. I want our citizens to be informed and participate in the government of their home City.

Our next project will be a focus on the Union Avenue School property and we'd like your input. There will be a "Union Avenue School Town Hall Meeting" on Thursday, August 9th at 7 pm at City Hall. Please attend, as your input is important to us.

Hope to see you at one of the above Town Hall Meetings; in the meantime, slow down, be careful and enjoy the summer!

"NOTABLE MARGATIANS" – SUMMER 2012 ROY GOLDBERG, BUSINESSMAN & PHILANTHROPIST

Roy Goldberg, of Margate is president of Gold Transportation which coordinates over 1000 charter flights per year from over eighty cities into Atlantic City. Over 180,000 tourists arrive and depart each year on Gold Transportation flights, making it the largest charter operator at the Atlantic City International Airport.

After working in his family's hotel business and then at Caesars World as its first director of Casino Marketing and assistant to the vice president of Casino Operations in the 1970s, Goldberg started the first independent junket business in New Jersey in 1981, forming a gaming-related travel business that provided customers and air transportation to the Atlantic City casino industry. In 1984 the business expanded with the startup of Sterling Coach Lines and the purchase of Grey Line Tours of Atlantic City. These businesses operated under the corporate heading of Sterling Transportation Services, moving thousands of employees and customers to the casinos. In a 1992 corporate restructuring, Sterling Transportation Services was sold to a New York company and the corporation was renamed Gold Transportation Group, Inc. Also that year, Goldberg entered the publishing business with the first issue of Atlantic City's only in-flight magazine *Fun 'N' Games*. The editorial content of *Fun 'N' Games* is designated to promote Atlantic City tourism and serve as a guide to entertainment and local attractions. Over 35,000 tourists now see each issue.

From the inception of Gold Transportation Group, Inc. until today, the scope of the corporation has changed dramatically. Over those years, Goldberg has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to community involvement.

Goldberg initiated the Gold Invitational Golf Tournament in 1988. It continues as the foundation's major fund raiser. In 2002 as part of the Gold Foundation, Goldberg established The Shirley Mae Breast Cancer Assistance Fund in honor of his mother, a breast cancer survivor. To date, through the Shirley Mae Run & Walk held each May, the fund has raised and donated over \$1,200,000 to breast cancer patients in southern New Jersey. This program provides relief for the unanticipated financial burdens of purchasing prescribed breast cancer medications that exceed insurance coverage, prostheses and wigs.

During the past 24 years, \$2,600,000 has been donated as a direct result of the Gold Invitational Golf Tournament, The Shirley Mae Run & Walk, and the Margate Rock Festival held on the bay in Margate.

Goldberg served as a director of The Boardwalk Bank in Linwood from 1999 until its sale to Cape Bank in 2008. In 2010 he was elected to the board of Cape Bank. He serves as vice chairman of Bacharach Institute for Rehabilitation in Galloway Township, and as a board member of the AtlantiCare System Board of Trustees. He also serves as chairman of The Gold Foundation and a board member emeritus for The ARC of Atlantic County. He previously served on the boards of Seashore Gardens and the Jewish Community Center in Margate, New Jersey.

Goldberg and his wife, the former Joanne Perskie, have three children.

ZONING TIDBITS By ROGER RUBIN, ZONING OFFICER

HOME OCCUPATIONS

We are often asked if home occupations are permitted in homes in Margate, and the answer is "Yes," provided it truly is a home occupation as defined. The restrictions are:

- The practitioner must be the owner of the home in which the business is taking place, and must be the resident as well, along with his/her family.
- There may be NO non-resident employees in the home; only family members may work in the home occupation.
- There can be no outward physical appearance of a business, such as signs or mailbox indicators.
- You may not sell anything at the home, nor have customers present at any time; no clients may visit the site.
- There may be no deliveries (other than normal residential deliveries).
- You can't have any equipment in the home business that creates noise, fumes, odors, electrical interference.
- The home occupation must be "incidental and subordinate" to the principal use of the dwelling, as a residence for your family.

FLOOD WARNINGS

• Margate City has implemented the Global Connect system to issue flood warnings to its residents. Residents will receive warnings and evacuation information via their telephone. All advisories or storm warnings are broadcast by all local radio stations (WFPG-AM 1450, WMID-AM 1340, WOND-AM 1400) and TV stations (Channels 3, 6, 10 and 40), weather radio and police vehicles equipped with public address systems. Comcast Television will broadcast up-to-date weather information and local emergency advisories or evacuation orders on Channel 2. Other sources of emergency information will also be heard on local radio stations. The ORDER TO EVACUATE is given only when the best efforts of local and county Emergency Coordinators have evaluated the projections of storm headings and all other storm related information. All persons with disabilities, invalids, and those who cannot care for themselves should contact the City at 822-1151. This list is kept in confidence; however, it is

your responsibility to update or change this information. The local newspapers offer supplements with "What to Do" details when hurricanes threaten.
