SECTION 3; THAT the Business Administrator shall cause to be formulated a list of employees eligible for overtime to be filed annually with the City Clerk and CFO.

SECTION 4; THAT for Calendar Year 2024, the maximum base salaries as provided by this ordinance shall be increased by 3% for each position.

SECTION 5; THAT once established for the calendar year base pay may not be supplemented through merit raises during the calendar year without approval of the majority of the Governing Body.

SECTION 6; THAT all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 7; THIS ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

RESOLUTION #04-2024 AUTHORIZING AMENDMENT TO CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body of the City of Margate City, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey to adopt a cash management plan to comply with the requirements of NJSA 40A:5-14 and to provide a guide to municipal officials and employees in carrying out their duties concerning the receipt and disbursement of all funds of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the following requirement shall be adhered to:

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN OF THE CITY OF MARGATE CITY

I. Statement of Purpose

The Cash Management Plan is prepared pursuant to the provisions of NJSA 40A:5-14 in order to set forth the basis for the deposit and investment of certain public funds of the City of Margate, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing Deposits otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the Plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits, Transfers and the Permitted Investments will be done to ensure the safety, liquidity, and the maximum investment return within such limits. The Plan is intended to ensure that any Deposit or Permitted Investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

II. Authorized Depositories

The Municipality shall annually designate the legal depositories, funds in certificates of deposits, and other time deposits in banks by resolution in accordance with NJSA 40A: 5-15.1, that must be covered by the Governmental Unit Depository Protection Act, NJSA 17:9-14 et seq. (GUDPA). The Municipality is also authorized to invest its assets in the New Jersey Cash Management Fund and the New Jersey Asset and Rebate Management program. This resolution may be amended or supplemented from time to time, as the Municipality deems necessary. Such resolution shall be deemed a part of the Cash Management Plan.

III. Authorized Investment

Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Designated Official is hereby authorized to invest the public funds covered by the Plan, to the extent not otherwise held in deposits, in the following permitted investments:

- 1. Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America.
- 2. Government money market mutual funds.

- 3. Any obligation that a federal agency or a federal instrumentality has issued in accordance with an act of Congress, which security has a maturity date not greater than 397 days from the date of purchase, provided that such obligation bears a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or other external factor.
- 4. Bond or other obligations of the Local Unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the Local Unit is a part of within which the school district is located.
- 5. Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not more than 397 days from the date of purchase, approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of the Treasury for investment by Local Units.
- 6. Local government investment pools.
- 7. Deposits with the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund established pursuant to section I of P.L. 1977, c. 281 (C.52:18A-90.4); or

Agreement for the repurchase of fully collateralized securities if

- a) the underlying securities are permitted investments pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (3) of this subsection a;
- b) the custody of collateral is transferred to a third party;
- c) the maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days;
- d) the underlying securities are purchased through a public depository as defined in section I of P.L. 1970. C.236 (C.17:9-41); and
- e) a master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.
- 8. Certificates of Deposit
- 9. Savings/Checking Bank Accounts

IV. Authorized Signatures

The Municipality shall annually establish by resolution and adopted at its annual reorganization meeting the required signatories to all bank accounts.

V. Identification of Funds and Accounts to be Covered by the Plan

The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts contained in each fund of the City of Margate:

Capital Fund

Current Fund

Developer's Escrow

Dog License Fund

Law Enforcement Trust Funds

Lifeguard Pension

Recreation Trust

Trust- Other

Water & Sewer Utility Fund

The following funds shall not be required to be maintained in interest bearing accounts:

Change Funds

Petty Cash Funds

Payroll Funds

Trust Funds – to the extent that the deposit of such funds to an interest bearing account would require by law the payment of interest to the provider of funds.

Checking Accounts – established for the express purpose of paying bills approved by the governing body. The balances in these funds shall be kept at the minimum amount required for the orderly operation of the account.

Compensating Balances – maintained for the purpose of obtaining specific services from financial institutions. Such accounts shall be established only under terms of written agreements approved by the governing body.

VI. Designation of Officials of the City of Margate City Authorized to Make Deposits, Electronic Transfers, Withdraws and Investments Under the Plan.

The Chief Financial Officer of The City of Margate City and the CFO's designee are hereby authorized and directed to deposit, transfer and/or invest the funds referred to in the Plan. The CFO or CFO designee shall each have the authority to transfer and invest funds in excess of requirement in accordance with this plan in insured obligations, overnight repurchase agreements, collateralized repurchase agreements and certificates of deposit with eligible public depositories qualified by this plan.

In the absence of the Chief Finance Officer, the CFO's designee is authorized to transfer required funds to the payroll and checking accounts for the purposes of, and to the extent necessary for, issuance of required payroll and payment of claims and payables.

No person shall engage in an investment transaction involving the City of Margate City funds except as directed or authorized by the Chief Financial Officer. Prior to making any such Deposits, Transfers, or any Permitted Investments, such officials of the City of Margate are directed to supply to all active depositories or any other parties with whom the Deposits or Permitted Investments are made a written copy of this Plan.

VII. Procedures for Disbursement of Funds

- A. Payments shall be prepared by the Chief Financial Officer and submitted to the Governing Body for their approval;
- B. No municipal funds shall be disbursed by the Chief Financial Officer prior to approval of the Governing Body of the City of Margate City, except for:
 - 1. Debt Service payments;
 - 2. Payroll turnover to agency accounts;
 - 3. Tax payments to Atlantic County and City of Margate Board of Education;
 - 4. Investments and/or Transfers to\from Margate's Current, Capital, Utility or Trust Funds;
 - 5. Payments deemed necessary by Chief Financial Officer;
- C. The above exceptions shall be reported on an "Additions List" for review by Mayor and Council at each meeting when a Bill List is prepared.
- D. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-16 (c) and N.J.S.A. 5:30-9A.6, vendors do not require Claimant Certification for goods and services under \$6,600. The following require Claimant Certification:
 - Goods and Services over \$6,600.00;
 - 2. Advanced payments;
 - 3. Employee Reimbursements for Good and Services;
 - 4. Payments to 3rd party Lien Holders

E. Checks approved for payment for all City Operating and Trust Fund Accounts including the Water and Sewer Utility shall be signed by the following two signatures: 1) the Mayor and 2) the Chief Financial Officer. All checks are signed by a secure electronic signature and processed electronically or by Automated Clearing House (ACH) transactions per N.J.S.A 40A:5-16.5.

VII. Responsibilities

The Chief Finance Officer or Designee of the Chief Finance Officer:

- 1. Shall ensure that all funds held by the City are safeguarded in accordance with these procedures and applicable law.
- 2. Shall maximize the City's interest income by prudently investing funds in excess of immediate needs in assets providing a high level of security for both principal and interest earnings, and in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State of New Jersey and the City's Bond Documents. The following are permissible investment options for the City of Margate City:
- 3. Shall maintain records and control of all City bank accounts, petty cash and change funds, investments, and certificate of deposits.
- 4. Shall ensure adequate separation of duties between authority to transfer or invest funds and the responsibility for recording in, accounting for and reconciling the City's ledgers and other books of account.
- 5. Shall provide a monthly report that provides the summary of financial balances for revenues and appropriations.
- 6. Shall provide a report that summarizes investment made or redeemed in the past month, each organization holding local unit funds, and the amount of securities purchased or sold, class or type of securities purchased, book value, earned income, fees incurred, and market value of all investments as of the report date, and any other information that the governing body may request or the CFO deems prudent to report.

VIII. Liability

Provided that local unit funds are deposited or invested as designated or authorized by this cash management plan, the Chief Financial Officer and the CFO designee is relieved of any liability for any loss of such moneys due to the insolvency or closing of any depository designated by, or for the decrease in value of any investment authorized by, the cash management plan.

IX. Audit

This plan, and all matters pertaining to the implementation of it, shall be subject to the Municipality's annual audit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the above cash management plan be adopted by the governing body of the City of Margate City, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey effective for the 2024 calendar year.

RESOLUTION #06-2024 AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF CITY OF MARGATE CITY FUND BALANCE POLICY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey wishes to adopt a Fund Balance Policy in order to protect against anticipated and unanticipated events that would adversely impact the overall financial condition of the City; and

WHEREAS the Chief Financial Officer recommends adopting a Fund Balance Policy to help ensure the current and future financial stability of the City; and

WHEREAS, the maintenance of fiscal stability is particularly important to the prudent and efficient operation of government and in determining its creditworthiness; and

WHEREAS, the ability to adjust local government revenue forecasts during the budget year and from year to year may be limited to meet unanticipated expenditures resulting from, inter alia, natural disasters, unforeseen increases in operating costs, unexpected capital expenditures; and

WHEREAS, changes in federal and state government spending policies may impact local government revenues, particularly if reductions in such spending force local governments to increase their own spending to make up for the loss in federal and state government revenue; and

WHEREAS, sufficient levels of unassigned fund balance can assure the continued orderly operation of government and the provision of services to taxpayers and the stability of the tax structure; and

WHEREAS, local governments frequently utilize a percentage of the municipality's annual operating expenditures as the means of determining the appropriate level of an unassigned fund balance; and

WHEREAS, the City has followed an informal policy over the past several years to govern the use of Surplus funds in a manner as described above.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey does hereby adopt the following Fund Balance Policy for Fiscal Year 2024:

Purpose of Fund Balance:

The purpose of this policy is:

- o to establish a Fund Balance policy to meet the needs of the City to protect against unanticipated events that would adversely affect the financial condition of the City and threaten the provision of necessary public services. This policy is intended to ensure the City maintains an adequate Fund Balance.
- o to establish a Fund Balance policy that serves as the framework upon which consistent operations may be built and sustained.
- o to establish a key element of financial stability of the City by setting guidelines for the use and maintenance of Fund Balance. Fund Balance provides cash flow liquidity for the operations of the City. Fund Balance is used as a tool to mitigate and stabilize the amount to be raised through taxation to fund the annual operating budget.

 Definitions:

Fund Balance – Net assets, or the difference between assets, liabilities and reserves in a governmental fund.

Surplus – Surplus is another term used by various agencies and is often used interchangeably in New Jersey with Fund Balance. The use of the term "Surplus" tends to insinuate it is unnecessary or excessive. The Township does not endorse the use of the term

"Surplus" despite various State documents requiring us to report our "Fund Balance" under the title of "Surplus" in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:4-24.

Credit Rating – Credit rating agencies consider the adequacy of Fund Balance using a complex series of financial evaluations. The amount of Fund Balance on hand is important but is not the only consideration in the credit rating process of the City, which includes other economic indicators such as the stability of management, the rate of tax collections, the top tax payers, top employers and growth of the tax base. Rating agencies prefer to see Fund Balance policies of fifteen (15%) to twenty-five (25%) percent of annual City responsibilities.

Provisions:

It shall be the policy of the City of Margate City that unreserved, undesignated Fund Balance on January 1 of a given year should be between twenty (20%) to thirty (30%) percent of the previous year's operating budget.

Should Fund Balance fall below the twenty (20%) percent floor, the governing body shall take such action, aided by an economic plan developed by the Chief Financial. Officer (CFO), to restore the Fund Balance to the target level within two years.

Should Fund Balance exceed thirty (30%) percent of the previous year's Operating Budget, the portion over the ceiling limit shall be added to the Amount of Surplus Anticipated funds in the current fund budget and specifically ear-marked to reduce short-term debt over the amount that would have been appropriated. If there is no short-term debt, or if the CFO determines it to be more fiscally prudent, the amount over the ceiling limit shall be used to either reduce un-issued debt over the amount that would have been appropriated, or reserved for future tax relief.

After the Annual Financial Statement has been filed, the CFO shall report to the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City on the status of Fund Balance as it relates to this policy. This report will then be considered during budget deliberations.

In any event, the amount of Surplus funds anticipated as a revenue in any budget year may not exceed the amount of Surplus funds re-generated from the previous budget year without a resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, adopted prior to the introduction of the budget.

This Surplus Policy is to be adopted annually as early in the budget year as practicable and is subject to adjustment as necessary.
