The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held on the above date at 4:00 p.m. at the Margate City's Historic City Hall Court Room, 1 South Washington Avenue.

Lisa Hagan, Assistant to the City Clerk, reads the statement of compliance, followed with the flag salute and roll call: Mayor Michael Becker and Commissioner John Amodeo were present. Commissioner Blumberg was present via phone. Ed Dennis, Chief Dan Adams, Chief Matt Hankinson, Johanna Casey, and Rich Deaney were present. Scott Abbott was present via phone. The minutes from the October 15, 2020 Regular Meeting and the October 15, 2020 Capital/Workshop Meeting were approved as read on motion by Commissioner Amodeo, seconded by Mayor Becker, with a vote of three ayes.

Public Comment:

Steve Jasecki, 112 N. Lancaster Ave.: Speaks on supporting increasing the number of trees in Margate.

John Sewell, 22 West Drive: Speaks on the need to decrease the tax rate in Margate and not giving a penny to the Army Corps of Engineers for the beach replenishment.

Steve Worner, 103 N. Sumner Ave.: Speaks on the general election held on November 3, 2020.

Susan Alice, 5 East Drive: Proud to live in Margate. Speaks in support of increasing the number of trees in Margate.

Seeing that there were no additional comments, a motion to close Public Comments was put forth by Commissioner Amodeo, seconded by Mayor Becker, with a vote of three ayes.

Ordinances Introduction:

A motion to introduce **Ordinance** #11-2020, Amending and Supplementing Chapter 103 Bulkheads, so as to implement controls and standards with regard to pile driving and vibration levels as verbally amended, was put forth by Mayor Becker, seconded by Commissioner Amodeo, with a vote of three ayes.

ORDINANCE NO. 11 – 2020 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 214 – PILE DRIVING FOR UPLAND FOUNDATIONS SO AS TO IMPLEMENT CONTROLS AND STANDARDS WITH REGARD TO PILE DRIVING AND VIBRATION LEVELS

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, Atlantic County, State of New Jersey, have determined that in the best interest of public health, safety and welfare, there exists a need to implement standards and controls with regard to the driving of piling and cause of ground vibration caused by pile driving for foundations of new construction; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined to establish Chapter 214 – Pile Driving as follows.

SECTION 1. Chapter 214 is hereby established to read "Pile Driving for Upland Foundations".

SECTION 2. Section 214-1- Definitions:

Vibration, Impact. Earth borne oscillations occurring in discrete pulses at less than 60 per minute.

Vibrations, Steady-State. Continuous earth borne oscillations. Discrete pulses occurring 60 or more times per minute are usually considered steady-state vibrations.

1. Vibration.

- **A.** Vibration, as used in these performance standards, refers to ground-transmitte oscillations. They shall be measured with a seismograph or complement of instruments capable of recording vibration displacement and frequency particle velocity or acceleration simultaneously in three mutually perpendicular directions.
- **B.** Maximum permitted vibration levels. Table I designates the applicable columns of Table II that apply on or beyond adjacent lot lines within the zone and on or beyond appropriate district boundaries. Vibration shall not exceed the maximum permitted particle velocities of Table II. Readings may be made at points of maximum vibration intensity.

- C. For purposes of these performance standards, steady-state vibrations are vibrations which are continuous or vibrations in discrete impulses more frequent than 60 per minute. Discrete impulses which do not exceed 60 per minute shall be considered impact vibrations.
- **D.** Between the hours of 7:00 p.m. through 7:00 a.m., all diving of piling is prohibited unless an emergency has been declared by a Governmental authority.
- **E.** During impact vibration operations, vibration monitoring must occur in accordance with N.J.A.C 12:190-7.26.
- F. For all upland piling vibration monitoring must be performed using a seismograph with a triaxial geophone that records particle velocity displacement in three (3) mutual perpendicular directions (vertical and two (2) horizontal directions). The seismograph must have a peak particle velocity dynamic range of up to ten (10) inches per second and a sample rate of one thousand twenty-four (1,024) samples per second per component. The seismograph must continuously record and store the highest

peak particle velocity at a minimum of three (3) second intervals. A caution level of 75% of the maximum level shall be established for each job site. If ground vibrations reach the caution level, the seismograph must record a waveform event in order to measure the frequency of the vibration and the particle velocity. All vibration monitoring must be performed by an individual trained in vibration monitoring that is under the direct supervision of a New Jersey Licensed Engineer.

G. The installer of the pilings, sheet piling, foundation pilings and other pilings of any kind shall submit a record of the recordings to the Construction Office within 5 days of completing the work.

SECTION 3: Section 214-2 **Permit required for erection and reconstruction**:

Applications for permits to perform pile driving for upland foundations shall be accompanied with plans showing size, location, configuration and specification of materials to be used in the placement of upland foundation piling as well as the manner in which such materials shall be incorporated into the upland foundation piling.

SECTION 4: Section 214-3 Notification to Adjacent Property Owners.

Prior to the commencement of work to install upland foundation piling, the contractor shall notify the owner of all properties contiguous to the subject property for which the piling are to be installed. All notifications shall be in writing and shall include the name, address and telephone number of the piling installation contractor and the owner of the property, the street address, lot and block of the property and the date(s) on which the piling installation is to be done and shall be delivered at least ten (10) calendar days prior to the commencement date of the pile installation activity, and shall be forwarded by either personal delivery to the owner(s) or certified mail.

Notification shall be forwarded to the properties mailing address as set forth on the Margate City tax bill for each property. Proof of such notification to contiguous property owners shall be furnished to the Construction Office prior to the commencement of pile driving.

SECTION 5. Section 214-4 Insurance requirements for Piling Contractors.

All piling contractors prior to issuance of a Permit shall present to the Construction Office proof of insurance coverage by way of an insurance certificate indicating that the contractor has personal injury and property damage liability insurance in a minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. Such insurance coverage must be in effect during the duration of the Permit. The City of Margate City as an interested party shall be notified of the cancellation of lapse of any policy. In the event that said policy is cancelled or lapsed and is not immediately renewed or replaced, the Permit issued hereunder shall be revoked.

SECTION 5. Section 214-4 SIGNS.

Every upland foundation pile driving construction site in Margate shall have a sign eighteen (18") inches in width and twenty-four (24") inches in height posted at the site which shall contain a phone number given to the contractor by the City of Margate advising people to call if they believe any violation of this section has occurred.

SECTION 6. Section 214-5 - Violations and Penalties.

Any person, firm association or corporation violating the provisions of this chapter shall be subject, upon conviction, to a fine not to exceed \$1,000.00 or imprisonment for a term not to exceed 90 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with any terms of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION 2; THAT in addition to base pay employees shall receive such compensation, longevity and other contracted benefits as provided in labor contracts or written conditions of employment approved by the governing body and/or as executed by the Business Administrator and appropriate Commissioner.

SECTION 3; THAT the Business Administrator shall cause to be formulated a list of employees eligible for overtime to be filed annually with the City Clerk and CFO.

SECTION 4; THAT for Calendar Year 2021, the maximum base salaries as provided by this ordinance shall be increased by 3% for each position.

SECTION 5; THAT once established for the calendar year base pay may not be supplemented through merit raises during the calendar year without approval of the majority of the Governing Body.

SECTION 6; THAT all ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 7; THIS ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE #10-2020

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE CITY, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 75-2 FEES AND CHARGES

Be It Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey the Chapter 75 of the Code of the City of Margate shall be amended and supplemented as follows (not less than two-thirds of the full membership thereof affirmatively concurring):

SECTION 1: § 75-2 Fees and charges. Shall be changed to read as follows:

In order to provide the necessary funds to improve, maintain and police the beaches, the following fees shall be charged for such facilities:

- A. No fees shall be charged to or collected from any person under the age of 12 years.
- B. Ten dollars per person per season, provided that application is made to the proper authorities on or before May 31 of the bathing season.
- C. Twenty dollars per person per season in the event that application is made to the proper authorities subsequent to the 31st day of May of the bathing season.
- D. Three dollars and fifty cents for senior citizens 65 years and older per season, provided that application is made to the proper authorities on or before May 31 of the bathing season.
- E. Ten dollars per person per week for any week or fractional part thereof of the bathing season. Weekly badges will be valid from 12:00 noon Friday until 12:00 noon of the following Friday.
- F. Twelve dollars for the purchase of each holiday beach badge. These badges will be valid for the following summer season only.

G. No privilege, right, badge or other evidence to use the beaches of the City of Margate City issued to or to be issued upon the payment of any fees provided shall be sold or leased to any person or entity by anyone other than the City of Margate City or its duly authorized representative,. Specifically, The City of Margate City or its duly authorized representative shall be the sole and exclusive vendor and/or purchase or lease said badges from anyone other than the City of Margate City or its duly authorized representative.

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in the manner provided by law.

A motion to adopt **Ordinance** #12-2020, Amending and Supplementing Chapter 175 "Land Use", was put forth by Mayor Becker, seconded by Commissioner Amodeo, with a vote of three ayes.

ORDINANCE NO. 12 – 2020 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 175 "LAND USE" OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE CITY, COUNTY OF ATLANTIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of Margate, County of Atlantic and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 175-2 Definitions is amended as follows:

1. Add: Deck, Roof

Shall mean a flat, open and uncovered platform above the highest habitable floor. Roof decks shall not be permitted.

2. DORMER.

Add the following sentence – Dormers may be permitted up to 40% of the floor area of the half story.

3. Add: PERGOLA

Shall mean a structure of regularly spaced posts or columns supporting of crossing rafters or trellis work. Pergolas shall not be considered as building coverage or impervious coverage.

4. Add: ROOF, EAVE

Shall mean the projecting lower edge of the roof that overhangs the wall of the building. In cases where the roof plane projects below the intersection of the roof eave and the top of the wall, this point of intersection shall be considered the

eave height. For residential structures, the roof eave shall be no higher than 18" (eighteen inches) above the top plate of the wall.

5. Add: ROOF, GAMBEL

Shall mean a gabled barn-style roof with a change in slope partway up the roof with the lower slope steeper than the upper.

6. Add: ROOF, MANSARD

Shall mean a roof with two (2) slopes on each of four (4) sides, the lower steeper than the upper. For purposes of this Ordinance, mansard roofs shall be considered float roofs.

7. Add: ROOF, PITCHED

Shall mean any roof with eighty percent (80%) or more of its projected horizontal planes (areas) constructed at slopes equal to or greater than five (5) in twelve (12). All other roofs shall be flat roofs.

- 8. STORY, HALF Add the following language at the end:
 The eave height of the half story shall be no more than 18" (eighteen inches) above the top plate of the second story wall below.
- 9. ADD: SUBDIVISION, "BY RIGHT"

Any minor subdivision not requiring any variances at the time of submission without any ne right of way or streets proposed.

10. ADD: SUBSIVISION COMMITTEE, "BY RIGHT"

A committee of at least three Planning Board members appointed by the Chairman of the Board for the purpose of reviewing subdivisions, along with the Planning Board Engineer and Planner, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and for the purpose of performing such duties relating to land subdivision which may be conferred on this committee by the Board including approval without a Planning Board hearing. Approval without hearing is granted under 40:55D-47 – Minor Subdivision.

SECTION 2. §175-26, Specific design standards shall be amended as follows:

- 1. D. Landscaping, (2) shall be revised to add the following:
- a. The tree requirements shall include street trees be placed within the governor's strip or behind the sidewalk at the discretion of the Zoning Officer considering the existing width of the governor's strip and the location of utilities.
- b. All street trees are to be maintained and replaced if removed at no cost to the City. Existing street trees with calipers greater than 12" shall not be removed unless in poor condition or pose a hazard to the welfare of the general public. The replacement tree shall be consistent with the City's Ordinance and the forestry management plan.
- 2. Section E Fences or walls shall be revised as follows:
 - (a) New number 7 shall be added as follows:
 - 7. For single family or two family residential properties, no fences or gates are permitted to cross any driveway. For multi-family developments, no gates or fences are permitted to cross individual driveways.

All subsequent numbers shall be changed.

- (b) New number 12 shall be added as follows:
- 12. Arbors shall meet the same standards as trellis with a maximum permitted width of 8 linear feet and not exceed 8 feet in height.

All subsequent numbers shall be changed.

SECTION 3. Article V – Zoning shall be amended as follows:

A. Section F – Schedule of Area, Yard and Building Requirements amended as follows:

Add the following to the end – Supplemental front yard setbacks for porches and principal structures for specific areas are listed later in this section.

B. Section E (5) shall be amended as follows:

Building heights in the S-25, S-30, S-40, S-40WF, S-50, S-60, S-60WF, TF and MF Districts shall permit, for 30 feet of building height regardless of plate height. Therefore, building heights of 30 feet shall be permitted in all zones other than S-25(HD) measured from Base Flood Elevation plus four feet of freeboard or if parking below is provided, 9 feet from grade. Grade shall have allowances for drainage towards the street.

SECTION 4. §175-33 – Accessory structures and uses shall be amended as follows:

A. Section [2] (e) shall be amended as follows:

Number [2] shall be added as follows: All beachfront lots may have third floor decks facing the beach or water that will not be required to be located within the building setbacks but shall comply with the setbacks for decks.

B. Section D (5) (b) shall be amended to read: The water edge of the pool and hot tub/spa shall be a minimum of six feet from the side and rear lot lines and shall not be located in the front yard if the hot tub/spa are one unit with the pool. Above grade hot tubs and spas with locking lids where not connected to a swimming pool may be setback 3 feet from a property line and may have two of the four sides against the principal or accessory structure such as a garage or shed.

SECTION 5. Attachments.

Attachment 7 – Schedule B-5 Residential Uses Specific Front Yard Setbacks shall be added.

SECTION 6. Land Use Schedule B-1 shall be amended as follows:

Yards – Minimum Front Yard shall read: For front wall of house, prevailing setback of front walls of houses within 200 feet in the same block, **unless otherwise provided in Schedule B-5.** Eliminate the high and low values before the average is calculated, unless there are fewer than 3 houses. Regardless of the average, minimum setback of at least 5 feet shall be provided.

For front of porch, prevailing setback of front walls of porches within 200 feet in the same block unless otherwise indicated in Schedule B-5. Eliminate the high and low values before the average is calculated, unless there are fewer than 3 porches. Regardless of the average, a minimum setback of at least 5 feet shall be provided. Porches or decks behind the front wall of a house shall not be included in the calculation

SECTION 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with any terms of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall take effect upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

Introduction.

Ordinance 12-2020 "An ordinance amending Chapter 175 – Land Use, Definitions, Schedule B-1, adding Schedule B-5, City of Margate schedule of standards, 175 Attachment 4:1" was introduced as an amendment to the Land Use Ordinance of the City of Margate, New Jersey on first reading; the City Clerk has provided a referral that the Ordinance has been advertised according to law and shall be scheduled to have a second reading and public hearing on the next available Commissioner meeting, November 5, 2020 and adopted.

The "Municipal Land Use Law" provides the Planning Board with thirty five (35) days from the referral date to prepare, review, adopt and transmit their consistency report regarding Ordinance 12-2020 to the City Board of Commissioners. NJS 40:55D-26 describes the Planning Board's responsibility regarding the mast plan consistency review as follows:

"...the planning board shall make and transmit to the governing body, within 35 days after referral, a report including identification of any provisions in the proposed development regulation, revision or amendment which are inconsistent with the master plan and recommendations concerning those inconsistencies and any other matters as the board deems appropriate."

The statute requires that every zoning ordinance must "either be substantially consistent with the land use plan element and the housing plan element of the master plan, or designed to effectuate such plan element." NJSA 40:55D-62a. "The Master Plan" referred herein is the as The City of Margate Master Plan Update adopted May 12, 2017.

Ordinance Summary:

The primary objective of Ordinance No. 12-2020 is to add definitions so that terms used in the ordinance, both existing and proposed, have a tangible meaning. The proposed ordinance also adds clarifications to already existing ordinances. The proposed ordinance also now requires street trees to be maintained in perpetuity and replace any that are removed within the public right of way or were permitted to be located behind the sidewalk due to an undersized or unusable governor's strip.

Also added are clarifications on fences crossing driveways with clearly not allowing them to cross with a gate or fence and reduce off street parking.

The ordinance will also permit third floor decks by definition and requires them to be within the building envelope unless on beachfront or waterfront properties where they will be permitted within the allowable deck setbacks.

A long talked about issue is providing an exact number for front yard setbacks, starting with 2 prominent streets in Margate City – Ventnor Avenue within the S-60 zone (Parkway Section) and Quincy Avenue. The intent of Schedule B-5 is to expand and get to the point where actual setbacks are known and remove the uncertainty and confusion of when to apply the default minimum of 5 feet.

Ordinance 12-2020 advances the following objective from the Margate City Master Plan"

- To review the City's history, document progress towards prior goals and objectives, and develop
 plans and strategies for how the City can continue to adapt and thrive in the future.
- Secure safety from fire, flood, panic and other natural and man-made disasters.
- Provide adequate light, air and open space.
- From prior master plans, address concerns about bulk and mass that arose after adoption of the 2004 Plan. Prior planning goals were renewed, revised, abandoned, where appropriate.
- Upon review of the master plan efforts, it became evident that items that were priorities of prior
 plans are no longer concerns and items that are significant concerns now are not mentioned in
 prior planning efforts. This can be expected to some degree when reviewing prior master plan
 efforts in any community. However, the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy has shifted the discussion
 and priorities of many coastal communities. The steps that a coastal community such as Margate
 must take to ensure its long tem existence has been taken for granted until recently.
- Section 4.5.6 recommends several changes to the General Development Regulations.

Consistent front yard setbacks that don't rely on changing or varying setbacks, inconsistent measurements and interpretations and other factors will provide a consistent front yard setback that will provide and help meet the goals of the master plan and the zoning plan.

I have carefully reviewed and analyzed Ordinance 12 - 2020 and the Master Plan. Based on this review, it is my professional opinion that Ordinance 12-2020 is consistent with the Margate City Master Plan and will help strengthen the goals and Objectives as described above.

WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs ("DCA"), through the Division of Local Government Services ("DLGS" or "Division"), has been deemed the lead agency for the distribution of the Local Government Emergency Fund (the "LGEF" or "Program"), provided through an allocation of the State of New Jersey's CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF Funds); and

WHEREAS, counties and municipalities excluded from the federal government's direct CRF allocation plan, as well as those counties and municipalities that are currently the most impacted by COVID-19 in comparison to their available resources, are eligible for LGEF funds pursuant to a maximum distribution determined by formula; and

WHEREAS, a total of \$60 million is currently being made available under the Program, with a potential \$60 million more to be allocated; and
