ORDINANCE #08-2022

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000) IN SCHOOL BONDS AND NOTES OF THE CITY OF MARGATE FOR VARIOUS SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE CITY OF MARGATE, NEW JERSEY

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF MARGATE CITY IN THE COUNTY OF ATLANTIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of the full membership thereof affirmatively concurring), DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Appropriation for Project

The improvements described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance are hereby respectfully authorized as school improvements to be made or acquired by the City of Margate, in the County of Atlantic, New Jersey (the "City"). For said improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefore and amounting in the aggregate to SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000).

Section 2. Authorization of Bonds

Negotiable bonds of the City are hereby authorized to be issued in the maximum principal amount of SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000) pursuant to Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes, particularly Chapter 24 of said Title and any other law applicable thereto. Each of the bonds issued pursuant to this Ordinance shall be designated "School Bond" and shall contain a recital that it is issued pursuant to Title 18A, Education, of the New Jersey Statutes. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance the payment of the local share of final project costs of the improvements or purposes stated in Section 3, negotiable note(s) of the City in the maximum principal amount of SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000) are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by applicable New Jersey law.

Section 3. <u>Description of Projects</u>

The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriations made for and the estimated costs of such purposes (including all work or materials necessary therefore or incidental thereto), and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for such purposes are as follows:

Renovations and Improvements to Eugene A. Tighe Middle School, including but not limited to repair and recoating of roof, including removal and disposal of solar replacements, panels, **HVAC** alarm loop upgrades and playground improvements, flooring replacement, replacement of performance seating, flooring and stage curtains, repair windows, and miscellaneous other improvements including costs of surveying, construction planning, architectural, engineering, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents and construction inspection and administration.

Section 4. <u>Authorization of Notes</u>

In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements, negotiable notes of the City in a principal amount equal to the said principal of bonds not exceeding SIX MILLION DOLLARS (\$6,000,000) are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. All such note(s) shall mature at such time as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer or such other Financial Officer designated by Resolution for these purposes (both being hereinafter referred to in this Section as Chief Financial Officer); provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its issue date. Such note(s) shall bear interest at a rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with any note(s) issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon such note(s) shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell the note(s) from time to time at public or private sale in such amounts as the Chief Financial Officer may determine and not less than par, and to deliver the same from time to time to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof as payment thereof. Such Chief Financial Officer is authorized and directed to report in writing to the Mayor and the Commission of the City at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the note(s) pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the note(s) sold, price obtained and the name of the purchaser. All note(s) issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time for periods not exceeding one (1) year for the time period specified in and in accordance with the provisions and limitations of N.I.S.A. 40A:2-8(a) of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is further directed to determine all matters in connection with said note or notes and not determined by this Ordinance. The Chief Financial Officer's signature upon said note(s) shall be conclusive evidence of such determination.

Section 5. <u>Capital Budget</u>

The capital budget of the City of Margate is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the capital budget and capital program is on the file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. Additional Matters

The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared and recited and stated:

(a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this Bond Ordinance are not current expenses and are properties or improvements which the Board of Education may lawfully

require or make as school improvements and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specifically assessed on property specifically benefited thereby.

- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes authorized herein, taking into consideration the respective amounts of said obligations authorized for such purposes, computed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:24-5 is **15 years**.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt statement required by N.J.S.A. 18A:24-16 and 17 has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the City Clerk and in the office of the Secretary of the Board of Education, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been electronically filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The issuance of the \$1,200,000 bonds authorized herein shall be included for purposes of calculating the net school debt of the school district of the City of Margate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:24-19, but shall be deducted from the gross debt of the City pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-44.
- (\$204,000) in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, a reasonable proportion of the compensation and expenses of employees of the City in connection with the construction or acquisition of such improvements and properties as authorized herein, and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law have been included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 7. Ratification of Prior Actions

Any action taken by any officials of the City in connection with the improvements described in Section 3 hereof are hereby ratified and confirmed notwithstanding that such actions may have been taken prior to the effective date of this bond ordinance and shall be deemed to have been taken pursuant to this bond ordinance.

Section 8. Application of Grants

Any grant moneys received for the purposes described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. Full Faith and Credit

The full faith and credit of the City are hereby pledged to punctual payment of the principal and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the City, and the City shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all of the taxable property within the City for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 10. Official Intent to Reimburse Expenditures

The City reasonably expects to reimburse any expenditures towards the cost of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance and paid prior to the issuance of any bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance with the proceeds of such bonds or notes. No funds from sources other than the bonds or notes authorized herein has been or is reasonably expected to be reserved, allocated on a long-term basis or otherwise set aside by the City, or any member of the same "control group" as the City, within the meaning of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-1(f), pursuant to their budget or financial policies with respect to any expenditures to be reimbursed. This Section is intended to be and hereby is a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse any expenditures towards the costs of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof to be incurred and paid prior to the issuance of bonds or notes authorized herein in accordance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.103-18, and no action (or inaction) will be an artifice or device in accordance with Treasury Regulation Section yield restrictions or arbitrage rebate requirements.

Section 11. Effective Date

This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

A motion to adopt **Ordinance** #07-2022, authorizing Calendar Year 2022 to exceed the municipal budget appropriation limits and establish a CAP Bank , was put forth by Commissioner Blumberg, Seconded by Commissioner Amodeo, with a vote of three ayes.

ORDINANCE #07-2022 CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City in the County of Atlantic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, City Commissioners of the City of Margate City hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$240,168.61 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commissioners of the City of Margate City, in the County of Atlantic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the City of Margate City shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$840,590.13, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the City of Margate City be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

RESOLUTION #72-2022 AUTHORIZING SELF-EXAMINATION OF 2022 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the City of Margate City, in the County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2022 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the City of Margate City that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:


- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
 - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
 - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

RESOLUTION #76-2022 City of Margate Resolution of Opposing NJDEP's Proposed Coastal Regulations

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) is planning to adopt new land use regulations that will significantly devalue land and stymic construction in the City of Margate known as the Protecting Against Climate Threats (PACT) Regulations; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP is proposing to require five feet of freeboard above the base flood elevation for new construction in the flood zone. Elevating new and substantially improved homes an additional five feet is not only prohibitively expensive for our residents but may not be feasible on many sites; and

WHEREAS, historically when NJDEP issues new rules they have been in alignment with corresponding legislation. In this case there is no legislation that has authorized the NJDEP to require more stringent requirements than the federal regulation that are now in place; and

WHEREAS, the NJDEP freeboard requirement is based on sea level rise projections for the year 2100. Municipalities are required to prepare Master Plans with a 20- or 30-year planning horizon, the City of Margate would strongly suggest that the State use the same time horizon that they required municipalities to use; and

WHEREAS, the science behind these 80-year projections have been questioned as reported in a guest editorial in the Press of Margate on Sunday, February 28, 2021; and

WHEREAS, there has been no major discussion concerning the magnitude of the economic impact of the proposed regulations or how to assist residents who will be negatively impacted. NJDEP's proposed regulatory re-alignment is expected to result in extensive and immediate economic impacts. NJDEP must engage in a meaningful, holistic economic impact analysis, and not simply rely on a one-sided analysis of potential economic impacts from future, projected climate change related threats; and

WHEREAS, in advance of the NJ PACT regulations being released the NJDEP is requiring municipalities to adopt a new Flood Damage Protection Ordinance that automatically imposes the NJ PACT regulations once they are adopted through the State rule making process.

WHEREAS, the new Flood Damage Protection Ordinance also requires that road and parking areas proposed in the flood hazard are be constructed at least one foot above the Flood Hazard Area Design elevation, that permits be issued for ordinary maintenance and minor work, that seasonally occupied structures be built on a foundation, among other new regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Margate opposes the Protecting Against Climate Threats (PACT) Regulations and the State's proposed Flood Damage Protection Ordinance as presented.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sea level rise projections being used by NJDEP be subject to a scholarly peer review prior to commencing the rule making process.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NJDEP regulations be based on a 20- or 30-year timeframe and adjusted over time to cater to the impacts of sea level rise and resiliency measures rather than based on an 80-year projection.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NJDEP seek the counsel from an independent economist to considering potential economic impacts prior to release of the NJ PACT proposals.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NJDEP provide follow the same practice as FEMA and provide detailed maps so that communities and residents can clearly understand how these regulations effect specific properties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the NJDEP abandoned changes in the local Flood Damage Protection Ordinance until the NJ PACT regulations are approved by the State Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Governor Phil Murphy, Lt. Governor Sheila Oliver, New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Commissioner Shawn LaTourette, Senate President Nicholas Scutari, Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin, Senator Vince Polistina, Senator Michael Testa, Assemblyman Don Guardian, Assemblywomen Clair Swift, Assemblyman Eric Simonsen, and Assemblyman Antwan McClellan.

WHEREAS, the City of Margate City of the County of Atlantic, New Jersey, has experienced natural hazards that result in public safety hazards and damage to private and public property; and

WHEREAS, the hazard mitigation planning process set forth the by State of New Jersey and the Federal Emergency Management Agency offers the opportunity to consider natural hazards and risks, and to identify mitigation actions to reduce future risk; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management is providing federal mitigation funds to support development of the Atlantic County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan; and

WHEREAS, a Hazard Mitigation Plan has been developed by the Mitigation Planning Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Hazard Mitigation Plan includes a prioritized list of mitigation actions including activities that, over time, will help minimize and reduce safety threats and damage to private and public property; and

WHEREAS, the draft plan was provided to each participating jurisdiction and was posted on the County Office of Emergency Preparedness website so as to introduce the planning concept and to solicit questions and comments; and to present the Plan and request comments, as required by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Margate City:

- 1. The Atlantic County Multi-Jurisdictional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan update, as approved by the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency on February 17, 2022, is hereby adopted as an official plan of the City of Margate City in the County of Atlantic.
- 2. The Municipal departments identified in the Plan are hereby directed to pursue implementation of the recommended high priority activities that are assigned to their departments.
- 3. Any action proposed by the Plan shall be subject to and contingent upon budget approval, if required, which shall be at the discretion of the Mayor and Commission and this resolution shall not be interpreted so as to mandate any such appropriations.
- 4. The Emergency Management Coordinator is designated to coordinate with other offices and shall periodically report on the activities, accomplishments, and progress, and shall prepare an annual progress report to be submitted to the Atlantic County Office of Emergency Preparedness according to the predetermined timeline and procedures outlined in the Plan's Section 7: Plan Maintenance and Integration.

R E S O L U T I O N #79-2022 AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDER #6 (REDUCTION) FIRE STATION #2 ADDITION

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Margate City, County of Atlantic, State of New Jersey authorized Resolution #76-2021 on April 1, 2021 awarding a contract to Aliano Brothers General Contractors, Inc., 2560 Industrial Way, Vineland, NJ 08360 as per their proposal for Fire Station #2 Addition, in an amount of \$604,840.00; and

WHEREAS, Edward Dennis, City Engineer, has prepared a letter dated October 5, 2021 regarding an increase in Change Order #1 that relates to upsized and additional gas piping, extra for discontinued split system, additional lighting, data, receptacles and CATV in the amount of \$20,203.00 resulting in a new contract total of \$625,043.00; and

Full Time Employees

Vacation is an accrued benefit based on a schedule of continuous service as found in employee group contracts or in individual employment agreements. Unless otherwise stipulated in an employment agreement, collective bargaining agreement or Civil Service laws, vacation leave is accumulated based on the following schedule:

- One (1) day for each full month of service during the first calendar year;
- 12 days for the second (2nd) through fifth (5th) calendar years;
- 15 days after the completion of five (5) years through 15 years;
- 20 days after the completion of 15 years.

Unless another provision is in a contract, the following shall be followed: If an employee is permitted to but does not use all allotted vacation time during the year in which it is earned, that employee will lose the days unless used within the first 90 calendar days of the succeeding year. However, if an employee is not permitted to use all their allotted vacation days during the year in which they are earned, they shall be used within 120 days of the succeeding year.

Part Time Employees

Part-time employees in Civil Service titles with regularly scheduled hours will receive vacation on a prorated basis using the above schedule. For part-time Police, Fire and Public Works employees, the prorated formula will be based on a 40-hour work week. The prorated formula for all other City part-time employees will be based on a 35-hour work week.

If a part-time employee is permitted to but does not use all allotted vacation time during the year in which it is earned, that employee will lose the days.

All Employees

It is the responsibility of every full-time and part-time employee to see that their vacation is planned well in advance of year end so that they will not have any unused days.

Approval of Vacation Leave

An employee's Supervisor must approve the use of vacation time, in advance. While approval of vacation leave shall not be unreasonably withheld, the use of vacation leave shall be subject to staffing levels as solely determined by the Supervisor or Department Head. Employees should submit vacation requests as early as possible to ensure adequate staffing. Absent emergent circumstances, a request to use vacation leave submitted less than three (3) days prior to the day(s) off being requested shall be granted only at the discretion of the Department Head.

Employees who have an approved vacation time scheduled, who call in sick the day before or the day following a vacation, holiday and/or leave, and/or any other authorized day of absence, may be required to submit a doctor's note.

An employee whose vacation request is not approved but who calls out on those days anyway may be subject to disciplinary action.

The City complies with all applicable federal and state laws with regard to payment of overtime work, including the New Jersey Wage and Hour Law and the federal Fair Labor Standards Act.

Under the Fair Labor Standards Act, certain employees in managerial, supervisory, administrative, computer or professional positions are exempt from the provisions of the Act. There are also employees who may be exempt because their compensation exceeds \$100,000 per year depending upon their job duties. The Business Administrator shall notify all Exempt employees of their status under the Act. The Business Administrator shall provide a list of all Exempt employees to the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) the beginning of each year. Exempt employees are not eligible to receive overtime compensation and are required to work the normal workweek and any additional hours needed to fulfill their responsibilities. Time off consideration for large amounts of additional hours may be provided with the Business Administrator's prior approval and at the sole discretion of the Business Administrator.

All other employees are classified as Non-Exempt and are subject to the provisions of the Act. Depending on work needs, Non-Exempt employees may be required to work overtime. Non-Exempt employees are not permitted to work overtime unless the overtime is budgeted and approved by the Department Head. Non-Exempt employees working overtime without prior approval will be subject to disciplinary action.

Non-Exempt employees are paid overtime for hours worked over forty (40) in a workweek at the rate of one and one-half times (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) their regular rate of pay. Non-exempt employees who work a thirty-five (35) hour workweek will be compensated at their regular rate (straight time) for all hours worked between thirty-five (35) and forty (40). For purposes of overtime, hours worked are computed to the nearest one-half (1/2) hour per day. Previously-scheduled vacation time and holiday time are considered time worked for purposes of determining overtime compensation; but sick time and personal time are not.

Employees may choose overtime compensation in the form of overtime pay or compensated time off (comp time). The maximum number of hours that an employee may accrue for future compensated time off (comp time) is 240. Once this maximum has been accumulated, all additional hours will be compensated by overtime pay. Accrued and taken overtime compensated (comp time) hours must be noted on the employee's time sheet. Employees engaged in Police and Fire protection work may accrue up to 480 hours of compensatory time.

Employees engaged in Fire Protection or Law Enforcement may be paid overtime on a "work period" basis. A "work period" may be from seven (7) consecutive days to twenty-eight (28) consecutive days in length. For work periods of at least seven (7) but less than twenty-eight (28) days, overtime pay is required when the number of hours worked exceeds the number of hours that bears the same relationship to 212 (Fire) or 171 (Police) as the number of days in the work period bears to twenty-eight (28).

This policy covers non-union employees. It also covers union employees to the extent that their collective bargaining agreements do not cover this.
