THE PRESS AND THE DOWNBEACH CURRENT WERE NOTIFIED OF THESE MEETINGS AND A COPY OF SAME WAS POSTED ON THE MUNICIPAL WEBSITE AND BULLETIN BOARD

The work meeting of the Board of Commissioners was held on the above date at 4:00 p.m. the meeting began with a flag salute and roll call: Mr. Becker, Mr. Blumberg, Ms. Taube were present. The following department heads were present: Mr. Deane, Mr. Abbott, Chiefs Wolfson and Tabasso, Ms. Larkin, Ms. McLaughlin, Mr. Galantino, Mr. Verna, Mr. Rubin, Mr. Walberg, Mr. Ricciotti, and Mr. Rubin.

Department Reports:

Mr. Rubin: Explained Ordinance #17 needed to comply with recently promulgated FEMA maps

Mr. Deane: Resolution tonight authorizing grant application for post-Sandy planning assistance & one to follow next meeting awarding contract (*recommended Jim Rutala Associates*)

Mr. Abbott: Lengthy discussion re: DUNES project

- Prepared ordinance to allow participation in the project & resolution for both binding and non-binding referendum question (*each has a different submission date*)
- DEP & ACOE reps can attend a public meeting on 8/15 but not a Saturday meeting
- Project is 100% funded for initial phase (*sand, dune grass, fencing*)
- Unresolved issues remaining: fishing pier, outfall pipes costs, draining (*grey area*), walkways, easements needed from beachfront home owners (*State required prior to beginning work*)
- Money must be approved now for expenditures (*“subject to appropriation”*)
- No agreement from State as yet – city requesting everything be in writing
- Margate Pier will need to be extended out (*“compensable loss”*)
- Easement costs (*\$500,000 in referendum question*): fishing pier should be handled directly with state not city; city only to consider nominal easement costs anything over should be handled by state (*taxpayers shouldn’t be paying for these*); possible to order “action to compel” beachfront home owners to allow ACOE to work on beach; Osborne Avenue Beach Club will require an easement; Mr. Blumberg wants to change ordinance stipulating that nothing more than \$500,000 will be spent since this figure is only an estimate; Mr. Becker – too many questions unanswered
- Referendum question: must inform residents of on-going costs & length of agreement; Mr. Blumberg suggested special election if necessary rather than be pressured into this without all the information needed to make the right decision for Margate & would support non-binding when all the questions answered to properly write a question; Mr. Becker favors non-binding especially since State not forthcoming with answers; Ms. Taube favors binding but will acquiesce to non-binding; Mr. Hiltner urged better wording of question since it appears misleading with the \$500,000 reference & confusing to general population

Mr. Walberg: Updated projects; Road Program to start September 16th; TMobile requested permission to place temporary antenna on water tower (*approved since within the original contract specs*)

Frank Ricciotti: Gazebo placed at Dog Park; helping with renovations of city buildings; on-going beach work

Ms. McLaughlin: Updated JIF/FEMA reimbursements from Hurricane Sandy & suggested hiring someone to act as liaison with state concerning these matter; additional funding available from MEL for damaged outside space (*benches, playgrounds, etc.*); CRS rating now 5 which allows 25% flood insurance discount for residents

Mr. Abbott: Filed petition opposing COMCAST moving its downbeach office

Mr. Hiltner: Water/Sewer disconnect notices distributed for non-payment; concern about pesticides used by landscaper (*complaints of dog owners of illness*) - log to be reviewed

Mr. Galantino: Further information on flood insurance rates (*non-primary homes to increase 20% in 2014, businesses to increase same in October & primary residents should remain same*); \$150,000 (*up to*) grants now available for home renovations needed from hurricane

Chief Wolfson: Philadelphia Highway Patrol requesting Thrill Show on August 24th (*approved*); undercover/ plain clothes operation on Wednesday - quality of life issues (*20 summonses issued*)

Public Participation:

Fred Weinstein – city should explore “master insurance policy” with other towns (*Brigantine, AC, Longport, etc*) to insure fixed annual cost and possible lower rates

Ed Berger – analyze true value of DUNES to the city before embarking on the project

Steve Altman – city should allow beach block parking during summer if DUNES are created since tax payer money primarily aiding beach block homeowners

Ann Pancoast – questioned length of time getting DUNES project to the public (*city asking questions before signing any agreement*)

John Sewell – avoid open-ended contract re: DUNES – get all the facts in writing & get quick responses re: easements before proceeding

Dan Gottlieb – read a written statement; forming Margate Citizens for Beach Preservation to present opposing opinions to ACOE & asked for equal time at the next scheduled meeting with the ACOE (*Mr. Becker will ask ACOE*)

Leonard Grossman – questioned if DUNES will help since Margate has irregular beach line (*question for ACOE*)

Sharon Simon – city should advise ACOE that another group will be speaking at the proposed DUNES meeting not asking permission; questioned cost to city to build its own dunes

Arthur Selnick – opposed to DUNES

Steve Woerner – questioned consequences to opting out of DUNES project

Bill Potts – will the DUNES benefit the CRS initiatives (*no per Mr. Galantino*)

Mark Rubin – requested new location for the lifeguard dock box as shed @ Osborne Avenue nuisance & safety issue (*Mr. Ricciotti: should be remedied within next 2 weeks*)

Larry Segal – problems with exiting Benson Avenue into Atlantic Avenue with illegally parked vehicles especially at Ventura’s Restaurant (*Chief Wolfson to look into*)

On motion this portion was closed with a vote of three ayes.

On motion the meeting was adjourned with a vote of three ayes.
